Strategies For Collaborative Problem-Solving & Decision-Making

HERE'S WHAT! SO WHAT? NOW WHAT? HUDDLE. (adapted from Groups at Work, Lipton, 2011)

This routine helps students to examine key ideas and findings deeply:

- > In the first column, they record key data, evidence, or ideas.
- > In the second column, they generate ways of interpreting this data, evidence, or idea.
- In the third column, they consider the implications of the data, considering stakeholders, goals, time periods, and contexts.

PROCESS:

- 1. Explain columns to participants.
- 2. Determine (sequence of) groupings: individual, pairs, small group, large group.
- 3. Ask participants questions along the way to guide them to greater precision, significance, and depth.
